## V. Principal/Director's Report and Recognitions and Awards <br> Mrs. Sherry Bees announced the following during her reports:

## Recognitions and Awards:

1. 2019 U.S. Department Green Ribbon School District Sustainability Award, flew to Washington, DC last week to receive this prestigious award that was only awarded to 35 schools, 14 districts, and 4 postsecondary institutions throughout the nation. We were selected for our innovative efforts to reduce environmental impact, utility cost, improve health, wellness and ensure effective sustainability education.
2. We were also named the top school district of the year for green sustainability.
3. The National Hispanic Recognition Program recognizes about 7,000 academically outstanding Hispanic/Latino high school juniors each year who take the PSAT/NMSQT. This year the invitation was extended to those students at our school that scored in the top $2.5 \%$ in our region. We are proud to announce that 12 of our high school juniors have been recognized with this honor.
4. We are thrilled to have been named a Silver Health School District. Schools that receive this award are working hard to serve healthier meals and snacks, getting students moving more, offering high-quality health and physical education, and supporting staff wellness and empowering them to be healthy role models. The award will be presented by a representative from the FLDOE at one of our upcoming SAB meetings.
5. We earned 3 Golden Bell Grants and the Go Teach Grant which will allow us to have our mobile augmented reality classroom.

## Principal's Report

## D. A+ Recognition Funds Distribution

Dr. Debra Vance Noelk provided the following overview of the A+ Recognition Funds Distribution.

The A+ Recognition Award Funds Distribution Committee Recommendation:

Teachers receive a full share of the funds and the remainder of the faculty and staff receive a half share of the funds.

1. Teachers are defined as those in the UFF bargaining unit and those contracted employees who spend more than $50 \%$ of their day working directly with students.
2. Faculty and staff are those who are employed by FAU and the cafeteria staff. It does not include the aftercare staff.
3. Part time employees would receive a share that is equitable to their duty time.

Faculty and staff who worked during the 2018-2019 school year who retired or resigned are eligible to receive the A+ bonus. New faculty and staff hired for the 2019-2020 school year are not eligible to receive the $\mathrm{A}+$ bonus.
