## NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

#### National Merit Scholars

- 24 FAU HIGH STUDENTS NAMED NATIONAL MERIT FINALISTS
- 32% of our seniors earned either NMSC Commended or NMSC Semifinalist designation, 14% of those qualified Finalist status.
- This school year, 45% of our senior class (79/175 students), have earned a National recognition for their achievements; this includes NMSC Commended, NMSC Semifinalist, NMSC Finalist and the College Board National Recognition designations of National Hispanic American Scholar, National African American Scholar, and/or National Indigenous American Scholar.
