New program dances its way into local classrooms

Typical of fifth-graders, Barbara Monteiro wasn't too crazy about boys until she took part in the pilot program for Dancing Classrooms at the A.D. Henderson School on Florida Atlantic University's <u>Boca Raton</u> campus.

Three classes took part in the Southeast Florida launch of the social development program that uses ballroom dancing to teach students everything from math and the visuals arts, to how to get along with the opposite sex. "It's pretty cool," said Barbara, 11, who already takes jazz and ballet lessons. "But she never danced with boys before," her mother Rosimeiri said.

Now it was show time, and Barbara, 11, and her classmates were all dressed up for a demonstration for benefactors at Woodfield Country Club, hosted by



philanthropist Maria Occhigrossi. The next day founder Pierre Dulaine, an award-winning Broadway dancer and choreographer, visited Crystal Lakes Elementary School in <u>Boynton Beach</u> to illustrate how his program is integrated into the curriculum. Sessions are 45 minutes, twice a week for 10 weeks. The 20th lesson is a school showcase.

Dancing Classrooms has served more than 170,000 children in New York City since Dulaine founded it in 1994. It's now in 509 schools in 24 cities. Antonio Banderas played Dulaine in the movie "Take the Lead."

Deborah Briggs, former president of the <u>Boca Raton</u> Theatre Guild, is executive director of Dancing Classrooms of Southeast Florida and managed to attract a group of like-minded patrons.

No stranger to ballroom dancing, Occhigrossi is a major benefactor of Boca's Ballroom Battle, the annual ballroom dancing fundraiser for the George Snow Scholarship Fund. She's also the mother of Olivia, a fifth-grader at Saint Andrew's School, and a budding ballroom dancer.

Occhigrossi has a vision for rolling out the program in Palm Beach and Broward counties. "I want all the schools to do this and then have a cotillion at Saint Andrew's" she said. "If we form a partnership with public, private, charter and parochial schools, than schools that can't afford the program can be adopted," she said.

Marleen Forkas danced in Boca's Ballroom Battle and is another Snow patron. Now she has lent her support as a member of the Founders Group for Dancing Classrooms Southeast Florida. "If you teach

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children the right thing, they will have it for a lifetime," she said.

Deirdre Radler, a famous name in ballroom dancing with her husband Daniel, has signed on as one of three part-time teaching artists hired locally by Dulaine and trained by him in New York. The Radlers dance on "America's Ballroom Challenge," and he is a 14-time U.S. National Champion. Deirdre teaches some of children privately, which is how she came to be involved with Dancing Classrooms. "She's the grace and the elegance of Dancing Classrooms and the wind behind my wings," Briggs said.

"Dancing Classrooms would not exist without the passion of Margaret Prince, a fifth-grade teacher at A.D. Henderson School. She has spearheaded the program along with the other fifth-grade teachers Gina Bove and Suzanne Sutton, and their principal Tammy Ferguson," Briggs added.
